1 Overall quality at a glance (i)

The reported resolution of this entry is 2.88 Å.

2 Entry composition (i)

There are 4 unique types of molecules in this entry. The entry contains 1616 atoms, of which 0 are hydrogens and 0 are deuteriums.

In the tables below, the ZeroOcc column contains the number of atoms modelled with zero occupancy, the AltConf column contains the number of residues with at least one atom in alternate conformation and the Trace column contains the number of residues modelled with at most 2 atoms.

Xtriage's analysis on translational NCS is as follows: The largest off-origin peak in the Patterson function is 6.44% of the height of the origin peak. No significant pseudotranslation is detected.

The Link column lists molecule types, if any, to which the group is linked. The Z score for a bond length (or angle) is the number of standard deviations the observed value is removed from the expected value. A bond length (or angle) with |Z| > 2 is considered an outlier worth inspection. RMSZ is the root-mean-square of all Z scores of the bond lengths (or angles).


